



POTLATCH OFF ROAD VEHICLE (ORV) POLICY

Off Road Vehicle (ORV) Use (Motorcycle, ATV, Snowmobile)

All ORV's are prohibited off-road. Vehicles greater than 48 inches in width are prohibited off road, on closed roads, or behind gates and barriers on Potlatch forestlands. ORVS must carry fire extinguishers during fire season – May 10 through October 20. Hill climbing, tree cutting, and dragging weeds that may release seeds is prohibited. Utility type vehicles (UTV's) must remain on maintained roadways open for standard vehicle travel.

POTLATCH UTILITY TYPE VEHICLE (UTV) POLICY

When traveling on Potlatch-owned property, UTVs, which are larger versions of the more typical all-terrain vehicles (ATV), are considered the same as full-size trucks and automobiles, and must stay on company roads open to standard vehicle traffic.

Potlatch defines a UTV as any recreational motor vehicle other than an ATV, motorbike or snowmobile, designed for and capable of travel over designated roads. More specifically, a UTV as a vehicle that is larger than 48 inches wide, has a wheel base greater than 61 inches and weighs more than 850 pounds.

Potlatch's extensive existing gate and trail system are not designed to accommodate the larger UTVs. Based on the size, footprint and construction of the UTVs, we consider them as having the same use restrictions as any truck, full-size automobile or Jeep.

Potlatch Rules for UTV Use on Company Lands –

- All UTVs must be currently registered through the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation prior to use on Potlatch forestlands.

- All UTVs must remain on maintained roadways open for standard vehicle travel.
- UTVs will not be allowed the use of roads that lie behind closed gates. They may not circumvent gates to access roads that are closed to full size vehicles.
- No off-road use of UTVs will be allowed on Potlatch forestlands.
- UTVs are not be authorized to use trails designated for ATVs.
- All UTVs shall not be operated in a manner that may endanger passengers, other motorists or individuals engaged in other types of recreation activities. Since these recreational vehicles will be sharing the roadway with industrial logging trucks and heavy equipment, special attention must be paid to traveling in a safe manner, including the avoidance of impeding any traffic.
- The number of passengers or load capacity shall not exceed the manufacturer's rated limit.
